Please Do NOT Apply Salt on Dirt Roads

Unfortunately, there are limited options for dealing with ice on dirt roads. Ice cannot be plowed down to dirt level. The only viable option is to spread cinders. Salt CANNOT be used on dirt roads; it will make a bad situation MUCH, MUCH worse. There are cinder barrels in the neighborhood for resident's use. Please avail yourself to some when ice is forecast.

Applying salt to dirt roads will make them mushy, muddy and virtually impassable. SHLOA will have no choice but to hold persons spreading salt on our unpaved roads liable for such costs. Help keep our unpaved roads open during winter weather. Please do NOT apply salt on unpaved roads!

Wilderness Vision by Brendon Leon

The leaves changed colors and slipped to the ground slowly and then seemingly, all at once. Drifting from deep green to color explosions of bright red and orange, this is the nature of the wild forests that congregate in the wilderness areas of our home, Sleepy Hollow, West Virginia.

Now, it is Winter. The middle ground between the lowly ground and sky is laid bare. One sees most the deep gray scales of tree bark jogging in repetition like the linear patterns of an exotic Zebra Wood. Looking into our own forests, such deep sight is a fantastic meditation that can strengthen the eye muscles of men and women who may have become addicted to the crystal displays of their smartphone- where the eyes can become accustomed to lethargy and focus less. The wilderness demands more. We must look, into the distance to plan a climbing trajectory on the various trails behind and near our homelands, in navigating the landscape- in staying safe. The subtle mountains that rise moderately in our picture windows are a fantastic sight- hidden from view by the spring and summer foliage.

It is our ability to see things accurately and to use proper judgment that is vital to maintaining the safety and comforts of our lands. If one cannot truly see something, one is unlikely to engage that environment or object correctly. Thus, our wilderness vision, in many ways, extends beyond the eye and is a deeply personal activity of the mind. It allows us to see where we have come and where we can go. Such vision also allows us to behold and enjoy the great beauty of nature prevalent in our community in-season and off-season.



Several Members of the community have sent emails with concerns. These concerns are relevant as we start a new year.

- 1. Cars parked and left at the mailboxes and lake parking lot. We would ask that cars not be left in these areas. Any community member is encouraged to contact police regarding abandoned vehicles at common facilities. Abandoned vehicles will be towed.
- 2. Please do not leave items at the mailbox, although we understand wanting to share items with others the area is not a swap mart or goodwill.
- 3. As we approach the summer please note that the lake is not an after hours party area. Swimming is at your own risk and the lake attendant is not a baby sitter.
- 4. Please remember the speed limit for the safety of our children and to cut down on dust come summer.
- 5. Please respect the signs for parking and waiting for children getting off busses so that no one is injured.
