## FROM THE BOARD

#### A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PRESIDENT

Road work this year started late due to unforeseen circumstances. The Board reviewed bids from several contractors in April. The first one we selected and hoped could start the end of May, informed us that because of the very wet spring and other contracts, they had to put us at the bottom of their list. Therefore, the Board decided to choose another contractor.

Unfortunately, the selected contractor did not begin work on the roads until the middle of June and progress has been slow. We were informed by the contractor that work was completed on August 31, 2016. We regret that the work on the unpaved roads took so long to complete. The Roads Committee will inspect the work and assure it meets contract specifications before signing off on project completion.

Meanwhile, work on the maintenance lot is progressing well. Trees have been cut where necessary and a driveway designated. The lot was graded in late August and stone/shale was spread for the driveway and the material pad where our salt box will be located. We have enough salt to last 2-3 years. The maintenance lot will be operational this winter. (*See photo on page 4*)

The lake and ball field are in good condition and have been enjoyed by residents all summer. I certainly hope all of you have enjoyed your summer and look forward to a beautiful fall season.

Road work for this year is complete. Sorry for the delay, we will take steps to assure it won't happen again.

Remember winter is coming so make sure your vehicle is prepared. We do pretreat the asphalt for snow and ice with salt and the use of cinder on hills but there is a 3" minimum for plowing to begin.

We have had problems with residents using salt on dirt roads, this cannot happen. Use of salt on dirt roads causes soft muddy spots that have to be dug out and repacked to fix, wasting money.

# Sleepy Hollow Snow Plowing Policy

Yes, it is almost that time of year again! It is possible that we will begin experiencing winter weather before the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter newsletter is published. Therefore, we are republishing our snow removal policy to keep our residents informed.

SHLOA follows a long-established policy regarding the plowing of roads during winter weather. The policy clearly states that roads are plowed whenever the depth reaches 3 inches anywhere in the development. We have unpaid volunteers checking on snow depth throughout the community especially in the problem areas. If the depth is not 3 inches, we do not plow due to our limited plowing budget. # BLOCKED OR MISSING DRIVEWAY CULVERTS ARE A MAIN CAUSE OF EROSION ON UNPAVED ROADS!

Please keep your driveway culverts clear of debris to facilitate rainwater flow into the ditch lines. Otherwise, the water flows out on the road and causes serious erosion damage, especially on the unpaved roads. Installing and maintaining driveway culverts is the responsibility of property owners. Please help us keep our roads passable by installing and maintaining driveway culverts.

#### WEST VIRGINIA CODE §20-2-58. Shooting across road or near building or crowd; penalty.

(a) In addition to any other prohibitions which may exist by law, it shall be unlawful for any person to shoot or discharge any firearms:

(1) Across or in any public road in this state, at any time;

(2) Within five hundred feet of any school or church; or

(3) Within five hundred feet of any dwelling house: *Provided*, That a person who is a resident of a dwelling house, and his or her authorized guest, may shoot or discharge a firearm in a lawful manner within five hundred feet of the dwelling house where the person lives, if the firearm is being discharged with the express or implied knowledge and consent of all residents of that dwelling house, and no other dwelling houses are located within five hundred feet of where the firearm is discharged; or

(4) On or near any park or other place where persons gather for purposes of pleasure.

(b) Any person violating this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not less than fifty dollars nor more than \$500 or confined in jail for not more than one hundred days, or both fined and confined.

(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a) of this section, any person operating a gun repair shop, licensed to do business in the State of West Virginia and duly licensed under applicable federal statutes, may be exempted from the prohibition established by this section and section twelve, article seven, chapter sixty-one of this code for the purpose of test firing a firearm. The director of the Division of Natural Resources shall prescribe such rules as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of the exemption under this section and section twelve, article seven, chapter sixty-one and shall ensure that any person residing in any dwelling home within five hundred feet of such gun repair shop be given an opportunity to protest the granting of such exemption. *Note: WV Code updated with legislation passed through the <u>2013 1st Special</u> <u>Session</u>. The WV Code Online is an unofficial copy of the annotated WV Code, provided as a convenience. It has not been edited for publication, and is not in any way official or authoritative.* 

Please obey all firearms and hunting laws and practice gun safety. Also, be sure to wear plenty of Blaze Orange outerwear as required by law whenever you are hunting or hiking. Have a safe and enjoyable Fall, and enjoy the great outdoors!

## **Resident Reports Bear Sighting in Sleep Hollow**

A black bear was sighted in Sleepy Hollow by a resident in late August. The bear was spotted in the backyard at the tree line. While this is not surprising due to the wilderness area surrounding Sleepy Hollow, we are informing residents so you are aware and take precautions to protect yourselves, your pets, and the bears. Please see information about black bears below published by the WV Division of Natural Resources.

## Division of Natural Resources Warns: Don't Feed the Bears!

The Division of Natural Resources cautions all West Virginia residents that the feeding of black bears is a violation of state law, as well as a misguided disservice to our state animal, according to Christopher Ryan, Black Bear Project Leader for the Division of Natural Resources Wildlife Resources Section.

"It is understandable that some people will illegally set out food to get a glimpse of this magnificent animal," Ryan said. "However, too often these actions regrettably result in the death of the bear. Bears that wander near residential areas in search of food are less likely to stay if they do not find anything to eat."

Bear populations have increased and expanded across the state in the last 10 years. "We have been receiving numerous calls concerning bear sightings from areas that have not had bears in the recent past. Bears have been reported in all 55 counties and we have received many reports of sows with cubs in the northern and western portion of the state."

Bears often become habituated to handouts and lose their fear of humans. When bears lose this fear they resort to raiding garbage, outdoor freezers, and other food sources associated with people. Unfortunately, if these activities are repeated, Division of Natural Resources personnel are forced to humanely destroy the offender for safety reasons.

"Unintentional feeding of black bears is a major concern to the Division of Natural Resources," Ryan said. "People need to secure garbage in bear-proof facilities and place trash out for collection on the morning of pick-up. Residents should remove all outside pet food at night, and bird feeders should be taken down, cleaned, and stored until late fall to further discourage feeding around human habitation."

Feeding of any wildlife should be avoided for numerous reasons including but not limited to disease transmission, increased predation, habitat destruction around the feeding site, ethical concerns, and the animal's overall health. Following these practical and common sense recommendations will reduce bear-human conflicts and assure that more of the state's animals will remain wild.

For more information on how to discourage nuisance bears or anyone experiencing bear problems should contact the local DNR District Office.
