Hello residents of Sleepy Hollow, this is Roger Brown V.P. of the Roads. To give you a little insight of what has been accomplished since I stepped back into the role as V.P. of the roads 3 months ago. The potholes have been temporarily repaired throughout Audubon, as well as the back side of Maverick has been scraped off and new shale put down (Due to salt being placed on it, that caused a muddy mess!) Please DO NOT PUT SALT ON THE DIRT ROADS!! (Salt on the dirt roads will cause it to not dry up, as well as not freeze and is very costly to the community!) IF FOR ANY REASON ANYTHING NEEDS TO BE PUT DOWN ON THEM, PLEASE USE CINDERS ONLY!!! The Blue barrels are filled with cinders to help with traction. If you encounter any issues, please feel free to use those (that is what they are for).

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Preparing your vehicle for winter is your responsibility!! Such as snow tires, studded snow tires, snow chains etc. We do live on the side of a mountain. Culvert pipes for your driveway are your responsibility to maintain and keep clear. Please keep your culverts clear, if they are blocked then the water flow will reroute and cause possible damage to the roads.

Mountain Lake Landscape has the contract this year for snow removal. So far they have done an amazing job at keeping the roads cleared and treated, and we plan on continuing our relationship with them for years to come. The roads will be inspected over the next month to prepare for spring maintenance. Thank you for your cooperation.

Four Positions open for Election in 2023

The Sleepy Hollow Lot Owners Association, Inc. (SHLOA) is a non-profit *corporation* organized and existing under the laws of the State of West Virginia. The affairs of the *corporation* are carried out by a Board of Directors elected by the membership (lot owners). You, the *membership*, are essentially the stockholders of the SHLOA *Corporation*. As such, you have a personal stake in the operation of the *corporation* and the SHLOA Board of Directors.

The operation of SHLOA, Inc. and the duties and responsibilities of the Board of Directors are spelled out in the SHLOA Bylaws. The Bylaws are posted on our website at www.shloa.com. Per the Bylaws, the 7-member Board of Directors consists of a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Vice President of Roads, Vice President of Common Facilities, and Vice President of Communications.

This year, four (4) positions (President, Vice President, VP Roads, and Treasurer) are open for election. Term of office is two years, beginning June 10, 2023 (the date of the 2023 Annual Membership Meeting).

You are encouraged to run for a position of the Board of Directors. Please see the CALL FOR RESUMES published in this newsletter and submit a resume announcing your intent to run for a Board of Directors position. Resumes must be received by SHLOA on or before April, 15, 2023.

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Resumes will be printed in the 2nd Quarter (May) newsletter, and the names of those submitting resumes will be printed on the 2023 ballot. Ballots will be mailed to each lot owner of record in May. Election results will be announced at the Annual Meeting scheduled for June 10, 2023, at 10:00 AM at the ball field pavilion.

CALL FOR RESUMES - SHLOA BOARD OF DIRECTORS

It is time to elect members to the SHLOA Board of Directors. This year there are four (4) positions open for election on the Board. Resumes received will be printed in the 2nd Quarter Newsletter and the names of <u>candidates submitting resumes will be printed on the ballot</u>. Ballot will be mailed to all owners of record in May.

You can self-nominate for a Board position by submitting a resume including your name, section/lot number(s), a brief description of why you would like to serve on the Board of Directors and any other information you would like to share with our community. Your resume will be printed in the 2nd Quarter SHLOA Newsletter. Resumes must be *received* by **April 15, 2023**.

<u>Eligibility Requirements:</u> A lot owner is eligible to run for a position on the Board if he or she is a Member in Good Standing. A Member in Good Standing is an Owner of Record and all lot assessments are paid as of the Date of Record, April 15, 2023.

Emergency Road Repairs; Maverick Road

Following the recent mid-January snowfall, the backside of Maverick Road was rendered a muddy, slippery, sloppy mess as a result of some unknown person spreading salt on the hill. As most folks know, spreading salt on unpaved roads will turn them to mush and make the road virtually impassable. This unmitigated (and unnecessary) man-made disaster required a significant expenditure of time and funds to repair.

SHLOA's Vice President of Roads, Roger Brown, facilitated the emergency road repairs in conjunction with our road's contractor. Our contractor brought in heavy equipment to remove the (muddy/slick) salt-contaminated road surface, clean and redefine the drainage ditches, build up the road surface with 6-8 inches of hard shale, and grade/crown the road to facilitate runoff and drainage. A special thanks to our contractor, Pentoney Brothers Contracting and VP Roads R. Brown for timely addressing this emergency repair.
